
Q1 Aging in place is the ability to live in one's own home and community safely, independently and comfortably, regardless of age, income or ability level.

Generally, how would you rate Readfield as a place for older residents to age in place?









# Q3 If you rely on others to drive you, how often do you find yourself unable to go anywhere you'd like to go?







# Q27 How many people are there in your household?



#### Q28 What is your age?



#### Q29 What is your gender identity?



## Q30 What range best describes your annual household income?



#### Q31 How long have you lived in Readfield?


