## Annual Town Meeting Warrant Secret Ballot Tuesday, June 12, 2018

To: Anna Carll, resident of the Town of Readfield, in the County of Kennebec, State of Maine

## **GREETINGS:**

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Readfield in said county and state, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 12<sup>th</sup> day of June, A.D. 2018, at eight o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act upon Article 1 and by secret ballot on Articles 2 through 41 as set out below, the polling hours therefor to be from 8 o'clock in the forenoon until 8 o'clock in the afternoon, said articles being the following:

Article 1: Elect a moderator to preside at said meeting and to vote by written ballot.

Article 3: Shall the Town of Readfield vote to allow the Select Board to establish <b>Salaries and or Wages</b> of town officers and employees, not elsewhere established, for the period July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019?
Article 4: Shall the Town vote to fix <b>September 28, 2018</b> or thirty days after the taxes are committed, whichever is later, and <b>February 27, 2019</b> as the dates upon each of which one-half of the property taxes are due and payable, and as the dates from which interest will be charged on any unpaid taxes at a rate of 8% per year, which is the State rate pursuant to Title 36 MRSA, 505.4?
Article 5: Shall the Town vote to authorize the Tax Collector to <b>Pay Interest</b> at a rate of 3%, which is lower than the State Rate of 8%, from the date of overpayment, on any taxes paid and later abated pursuant to Title 36 MRSA, § 506 & 506A?
