## About The Ants

## <u>Damage</u>

If you happen to encounter these ants, be aware that they will bite. They won't hesitate in using their stinger either. The sting is only a pinch, but it injects venom under the skin that burns from 30 minutes to 2



## <u>How To Get Rid of</u> <u>The Ants</u>

There is no exact method to rid ourselves of these ants, but there are a few approaches that may decrease the amount of invasions. These ants love moisture, they like to live in tall grass and underneath lawn clutter. Reducing the amount of standing water, and keep the yard maintained will help avoid the ant infestations.
