

Meeting called to order at 6:30 Secretary's minutes of April 28<sup>th</sup> were approved with 2 abstentions

Milt Wright will submit and pay for an ad to the Community Advertiser explaining why a yes vote is needed on the 3 Trail warrants on the Secret Ballot.

Ballfield Committee – Milt reported that a Porta Potty will be placed at the Fairground Complex. There was concern regarding cars parking along the side of Church Road. This is a safety issue. (A new sign has been erected near the entrance stating "caution recreation area). Will reminded us that this is a multi-use Fairground Complex.

Will Harris reported on the trail work done on the Mill Stream Trail. Work was done on May 17<sup>th</sup> by a large crew from our committee and other volunteers. Bob Bittar also has some ideas that will extend the trail on to his property. This extension, if completed will NOT use ANY town funds!

Hank Laidlaw reported on the site visit to the capped landfill on North Road. Several of our members along with Andy Tolman walked this site on May  $17^{th}$ . It was a good trip even with the ticks that joined the group. Rob spoke of the esker and an old beaver bog on the land. Discussion about whether this could be a year around trail. It will be fine in the dry times but wet in the spring. There could be winter use for skiing. Lenny Raye has expressed to Gary an interest in working with us regarding the gate. The gate will have to be moved back and gravel applied for parking. Ann made a motion "After July 1st we will begin the design and creation on a trail to provide public access to the capped landfill/esker trail. We will be working in consultation with the Select Board." Ken Clark seconded this.

Will Harris reported on the Factory Square /Bob Bittar/ Planning Board situation. Bob envisions opening a Community Center.

Rob Peale reported on the construction of a trail extension at KLT Echo 1 property. Rob and Milt have cleared and marked the route. Howard Lake worked on a trail toward a Beaver Dam. KLT has built a wooden viewing stand overlooking open water areas.

Fairgrounds Complex – Jerry will mark the trail where signs will be placed. Mark Birtwell will ditch an area approx. 200 ft. at the lower end of the McDouglaud Trail to prevent erosion from the ball field from washing over that section of the trail. We discussed the concern about the size of the existing parking lot and the safety issue of cars parking along the road. Milt told of the poison ivy near the entrance of the complex and near the ballfield. He will discuss this with Tim Sniffen.

Gary reported on the guest speaker remarks at an Augusta Trails Meeting regarding public awareness. More to come.

Milt reported on work to be done around the Union Meeting House to finish our Community Pathway. Bluestone will be delivered after the June  $9^{th}$  election.

Ken Clark reported on the long range planning he, Hank and Lydia are working on. We all appreciate the goal setting and recognize that this will be a great help to us.

Nancy Buker will explain at the next meeting an article that was passed a few years back at a Town Meeting which will allow gifts and bequeaths to committees to remain in perpetuity and do not have to be spent in a fiscal year.

Other business: All were invited to a Party at Milt's home after the June 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting to thank him for his many years of chairmanship. We will try to keep the business meeting as short as possible so we can celebrate this event.



MISSION STATEMENT: The Readfield Trails Committee will plan and coordinate the development of environmentally acceptable trails within the town of Readfield. The committee will promote safe, functional connections between the various activity centers of the town and provide linkage, where possible, between recreational trails within the town and with adjacent towns.

The Trails Committee at its meeting on June 23 voted unanimously to recommend to the Select Board that the trail along the Mill Stream Road from the Grist Mill Bridge to Old Kents Hill Road be called the **Mill Stream Pathway**.

The relatively short trail is along a portion of Mill Stream Road that is no longer used by automobiles.

You will note that unlike municipal elections, MMA does not provide for "Write-in Candidates" since our process includes an opportunity to nominate a candidate by petition, as noted above.

The MMA Voting Ballot must be signed by a majority of the municipal officers <u>or</u> a municipal official designated by a majority of the municipal officers, and received by the Maine Municipal Association by 12:00 noon on Friday, August 14. We have enclosed a self-addressed self-stamped envelope for your convenience. The MMA Voting Ballots will be counted that afternoon and the election results confirmed under the direction of MMA President Peter Nielsen.

#### TOWN OF READFIELD

## POLICY ON TREASURER'S DISBURSEMENT WARRANTS FOR EMPLOYEES WAGES AND BENEFITS

**Purpose:** This policy allows any two designated Select Board members, acting on behalf of the full Select Board, to review, approve, and sign municipal Treasurer's disbursement warrants for payment of employees' wages and benefits only. This policy is additional to, not in lieu of, majority power. Nothing in this policy is intended to replace the authority of the full Select Board, acting by majority vote, to act on any Treasurer's warrant, including warrants for payment of employees' wages and benefits.

#### POLICY ON TREASURER'S DISBURSEMENT WARRANTS FOR STATE FEES

This policy is additional to, not in lieu of, majority power. Nothing in this policy is intended to replace the authority of the full Select Board, acting by majority vote, to act on any Treasurer's warrant, including warrants for payment of state fees.
