

## **Town Manager Report**

September 19, 2016

### **Budget & Finance:**

- Tonight we are completing a bulk of the remaining paperwork for the new fire truck loan from the Maine Municipal Bond Bank.
- In October I will be presenting a draft Treasurer's report and will be looking for feedback from the Board and public.
- We have updated the Transfer Station billing for the Town of Fayette through the end of the fiscal year.

### **Solid Waste and Recycling:**

- I am communicating with the faculty advisor for the engineering students that will be doing some design and engineering work for the Transfer Station site. I am excited about the project and participants.
- The Solid Waste and Recycling committee is working on a revised interlocal agreement and other document revisions to reflect Fayette's current and prospective future involvement.
- I've secured digital copies of the most recent Transfer Station site design and survey work from 1992. Unfortunately, they don't reflect the current configuration, though they cover a lot of it.

### **Maintenance & Infrastructure:**

- Paving was completed last week. We do have a punch list to work through and several outstanding issues will be addressed by the contractor.
- The Maranacook Dam Project is beginning to settle down and you have a revised engineering proposal in your packets.
- The box culvert at Torsey Pond is in need of minor repairs, of which the Town is likely responsible for about 90%. The dam association will be responsible for the rest. This will be a budget item up for consideration.

### **Personnel:**

- I want to welcome Bryer Carlson as our new seasonal maintenance employee.
- "Town" email accounts have been set up for the Budget Committee and we will be transitioning the Select Board and staff to the new accounts over time.

### **Announcements:**

- I attended the Age Friendly Community Conference last Tuesday and was impressed with the number of communities involved and their work.
- I attended General Assistance training on Friday and am now familiar with a number of changes, best practices, and a new online portal for GA research and reimbursement processing.
