Administration and Personnel:

- The Beach is no longer staffed as our seasonal employees have returned to school. Maintenance staff will keep an eye on the facility. Thanks to Noah and Seth for keeping the beach clean and providing a friendly environment.
- Thank you to everyone who attended our Summer Residents Meeting on August 5 and our Harbors and Moorings Public Hearing on August 26.
- The Manager's Institute was valuable as always and I want to thank the Select Board for encouraging and supporting professional development for me, and all of our staff.

Roads, Traffic, Parking and Safety:

- Crack sealing is complete for the year. We completed work on several roads including Thundercastle, Chase, Old Kents Hill Rd, and Lane Rd.
- The RFP for design services for the Church Rd. Sidewalk has closed and we have five proposals to review with members of the Road Committee.
- Town-wide striping and Church Rd. maintenance and paving RFPS are on the agenda for this evening.
- RFPs will be issued in September for special paving projects at Readfield Corner, Nickerson Hill and P Ridge, and the Readfield Library. We will also issue a town-wide culvert repair and replacement RFP.
