Call to Order

Welcome & Introductions – 5 min.

> The Select Board and Budget Committee introduced themselves.

Review of Budget & Meeting Goals - 5 min.

Kathryn discussed the budget and meeting goals and explained the responsibilities of each the Select Board and Budget Committee in the budget process.

Presentation & Discussion of Summary Budget Information - 80 min.

- Fric presented the budget draft via slideshow. He also explained the difference between designated and undesignated funds.
- RSU 38 estimated tax increase at 10% but could change as the RSU continues to work on their budget. The County increased taxes 5% overall with only about 1% increase for the town of Readfield because there has been less growth here than other towns.
- The Fire Department sprinkler system is already bonded for \$200K at 1.9% interest. The fire marshal informed Eric that if no one is using the overnight rooms at the Fire Department the need for a sprinkler system could wait. There is an opportunity to use that bond toward the new firetruck to lessen the interest on a large chunk of the fire truck purchase, leaving the remaining amount to be bonded with a higher interest rate as anticipated. The last firetruck bond from 2016 is due to be paid off in FY24.
- 4.4% or about \$46K increase in the municipal budget for FY24. Nearly identical to the tax impact in 2020.
- Estate of Maine has been increasing tax values of homes about 10% over the last couple of years, Readfield revaluation begins this year in order to keep up with the state so the town can get tax breaks through the state and to keep the mil rate down. Estimated mil rate currently 15.92. The mil rate and the valuation work hand in hand to keep property taxes linear and ensure the town can use the maximum homestead exemption allowance for resident's homes.

Paula Clark – Planning Board Chair - annual review ongoing of the ordinance and a package with revisions. Planning board revisions will be discussed at their next meeting on March 27, once the board

agrees on the revisions, they will present it to the Select Board for approval. This year there is some clarity and reorganization being done, the board has modified some language to make standards clearer and included pieces from state legislature.

Proposed Beach Ordinance

The Beach became free to residents in the last few years, due to that transition, and without having formal rules already for the beach; an ordinance is being proposed to give an administrative structure to better care for the beach. The ordinance provides a legal basis to keep things on track for beach use.

Proposed Comprehensive Plan Update

✓ Jessica Gordon – Comprehensive Plan Committee Chair – started process in 2020, derailed by the pandemic. Most of the draft is on the town website available for review. Nearly 300 responses to the surveys and those responses are also on the website. KVCOG has been a great help with the plan update. Nearing the end of the process, will be voted on in June.

Sean motioned to extend the meeting for ten minutes, Carol seconded.

The entire Comprehensive Plan is voted on as a singular vote, if it is voted down it will be relooked at. Now is the time to discuss changes with the committee. The plan does not obligate the town to spend anything.

READFIELD – Willard Robert Harris, Jr., passed away at his home in Readfield with his loving wife Bonnie and friends at his side on Sunday, March 12, 2023. He finally succumbed to pulmonary fibrosis, a degenerative lung disease that he was diagnosed with in 2015, after an admirable fight to stay with us. Will grew up in a farmhouse referred to as the "Old Homestead" in West Gardiner, the son of Margaret and Willard Robert Harris, Sr.

Will graduated the salutatorian of Gardiner High School in 1969 and went on to attend the University of New Hampshire in Durham. At UNH he studied psychology, played in a rock band, and worked in drilling and blasting on construction sites during summers. He also met his first wife, Catherine (Leblanc) Gibson, with whom he would later have a son, Andrew, in 1984 and a daughter, Margaret, in 1986.

Following graduation from UNH, Will worked as a mental health aide at Bangor Mental Health Institute for a short time before starting his 38-year career in Maine state government. Will served in the Department of Conservation for 30 years, the last seven of which he was Director of the Bureau of Parks and Lands. He was a champion of public parks and lands, and believed in equity of access for all the people of Maine. Included among his professional accomplishments are the State Parks Passport, the Loon Plate, and the Take It Outside program.

In 1992, Will remarried and joined families with his wife, Bonnie, becoming a stepfather to Casey Coyne, Caitlyn Coyne, Heide Provencher, and Shawn Provencher. Will was a supportive and caring father to all of his children. He and Bonnie moved to Readfield where they enjoyed 30 years of marriage.

Will's great passions were his family, music, and fishing. He was the proud owner of a fishing boat and he loved to take his children to the local lakes. He also led longer family camping trips (sometimes despite the weather), and vacations to a fishing and hunting camp in Northern Maine. Will was an avid reader, and his interests spanned genres but included his beloved "cowboy stories." He was witty and intellectual, and will be remembered as a great thinker.

Will always had a love of music, both listening and playing, sometimes his own original music. He started on the drums in high school in his first band "Another Quality Product," then learned guitar in college which he continued to play for the rest of his life. Family and friends will recall that on a visit to Bonnie and Will's house, Will was frequently found in his music room or on the front porch in nice weather, playing his guitar. After being diagnosed

with pulmonary fibrosis, he produced three original albums with the help of his long time friend, Pat Colwell. The last album, One More Thing Before I Go, was recorded while requiring oxygen.

Will is survived and remembered with love by his wife, Bonnie Harris; his children, Andrew Harris, Margaret Goldstein, Caitlyn Coyne, Casey Coyne and Heide Provencher; his sons-in-law, Jarrod Goldstein, Paul-Joseph Cummings and Dana Drummond, his daughter-in-law, Carrie Provencher; his grandchildren, Mariah Provencher, Benjamin Goldstein, Eva Goldstein and Saul Cummings; his sister, Carol Harris Despres, her three children and their partners and her five grandchildren; his brother-in-law, Peter Kellman and sister-in-law, Rebekah Yonan.

He was predeceased by his sister, Melodie; and his son, Shawn Provencher.

There will be a private graveside memorial service in the spring. All of Will's family and friends will be invited to a celebration of life when the weather is warm.



Good morning,

I didn't want to ruin anyone's weekend so i'm delivering some unfortunate news this morning. Our RFP / Bid Opening came and went on Friday with no proposals submitted for either the Fire Station Sprinkler Project or the Library Egress / Renovation Project. During the site visits several weeks ago we had three firms show at the Fire Station and no one at the Library. The contractors at the Fire Station had concerns about the scope of the project and cost. Follow up with local contractors on the possibility of working on the Library project gave the impression there was some interest but work was booked out 18-24 months.

I will be working with Chief Mank on thoughts (a memo?) around the Fire Station Sprinkler System, and likely with Melissa and Pam on something similar for the Library, but can't say when that would be discussed. I think we have an active construction market and lingering cost and supply effects from the pandemic pushing contractors toward larger more profitable (and perhaps less nuanced) projects. I think we will want to take different approaches with the Library and Fire Station, but again want to speak with several people before proposing a path forward to the Select Board.

- **1. Article 3, Section 4 Non-conforming structures.** Reorganization and language changes for clarity relating to shoreland zoning
- 2. Article 6, Section 3 Allowing electronic submissions in lieu of paper submissions. Change allowing an applicant to submit an application and required submittals electronically in lieu of 11 paper copies.
- 3. Article 8, Section 16 Screening of non-agricultural commercial, institutional and industrial storage and warehouses. Screening of non-agricultural storage areas, including warehouses. The PB can waive this requirement under certain circumstances.
- **4.** Article 8; Section 19 E Codifying State DEP Shoreland rule into Local Ordinances. State-rules currently place certain limits on the addition of more than one dock per lot; this will harmonize local and state regulation.

Hello Readfield Play Group Supporters,

We're excited to be back in the Readfield Elementary School Breakfast Room again! I wanted to provide you with an update for the first two months of our revival. The toddlers and preschoolers enjoy seeing the older children and all have been very polite and curious in welcoming us to their school.

Despite snowstorms, school delays, and February vacation, we met five times in the first two months. Over 44 people (including littles and adults) have played during January and February. This includes 19 children and 23 caregivers. We have had a range of ages from six months to four years. Towns represented include Augusta, Manchester, Mount Vernon, Readfield, Wayne, and Winthrop.

Our goals are to offer children a chance to interact and play freely. Songs, stories, finger plays and crafts are offered as well as ride-on vehicles, different types of building blocks, cars, and toys. Sharing is a difficult concept but one children learn by experience usually after age three. Two year olds are often not ready which is why we have lots of cars, trucks, and things that move.

Another program goal is to offer caregivers a time to talk with each other and play with their children. Thank you to all the big people who have helped design railroads, created towns, and built houses. An objective of play group differs from child care in that caregivers stay to play, also!

March came in like a lion with a snowstorm so we are hoping the warmer weather arrives soon. Future topics include celebrating leprechauns for St. Patrick's Day, spring, holidays, and plants. Barring weather problems, we will be at RES every Thursday morning from 9 to 11:30 a.m. in March. The school will be closed for vacation the week of April 17-21 so we will not meet that week.
