From the Town Manager

Exceptional Planning Brightens Readfield's Future!

Later this fall a 5-Megawatt Solar Farm will break ground across from the Jesse Lee Church on Rt. 17 and provide renewable energy to thousands of people, including many in Readfield. The solar project was on hold for nearly two years due to the pandemic and challenges with CMP upgrading their infrastructure in the area. What was not on hold was the development and implementation of a first-rate Solar Ordinance that was carefully assembled by the Readfield Planning Board and approved by voters in July of 2021.

The question of a solar farm in Readfield first came about in April of 2020. Over the course of several months and several meetings the applicant worked collaboratively with the Planning Board to steer this complicated and "first for us" project to a place where it was ready for approval in October of 2020. A permit extension was requested and granted in the fall of 2021 due to the factors mentioned earlier, and a final construction permit was issued in September of 2022. The smart decisions of the Planning Board and lessons learned from this project helped to make Readfield's Solar Ordinance truly exceptional!

Over the past year it has garnered a lot of praise and attention. The Maine Farmland Trust used our ordinance as a case study in their Solar Siting Guide for Maine Towns. This recognition was due in large part to the use of the town's Comprehensive Plan to help direct solar development. Several towns in the region and across the state have also referenced our ordinance in developing their own, in some cases adopting it almost verbatim. At least one additional solar farm being considered in Readfield and more are likely in the near future. Thanks to the dedication and skill of our Planning Board we know that we have one of the best models around for addressing what can often times be a challenging issue.

It is not an easy thing to protect the rights and values of our residents without compromising the ability of private business and residents to locate and thrive in Readfield. However, this kind of thoughtful balancing is the norm, and not the exception. It happens at Planning Board meetings month after month and time after time. I have observed and participated in dozens of these meetings and the process is fair and thorough. Of course every application is different and some do not go the way applicants want them to. In the end not all proposals can or should be approved if they fail to meet the criteria adopted by voters in the form of our town ordinances and plans. When applied by our Planning Board these documents protect the integrity, character, and economic future of our community and ensure that the best interests of the Town of Readfield are carefully considered. The success of our Solar

Readfield are carefully considered. The success of our Solar Ordinance is just one example of this, so thank you to the Planning Board and keep on shining!







The club volunteers have several more bridges to rebuild, signage to put in place and removal of felled trees and branches that might block trail passage. Winthrop Area Rotary Club is hosting an "Our Community Benefits" project. Please join us in our community build of Window Dresser window inserts to be held at the Winthrop Middle School beginning at 8:00am on Tuesday, November 15, 2022, ending Friday, November 18, 2022. We have created 2 shift opportunities 8:00am to 12:00pm and 12:30pm to 4:30pm for each day. Lunch will be provided at 12:00 for both shifts. If you are available and willing to help at our build, please call my cell (203) 641-7040 (Marge Livingston). No hands-on building experience is required.

Window Dressers is a grassroots, volunteer-run nonprofit organization that trains, supplies, and supports teams of volunteers who host Community Builds to construct Insulating Window Inserts for local residents. Together, Window Dresser volunteers have built over 48,000 custom-made insulating window inserts since 2010, with between 25% to 35% given to low-income families at no cost. Winthrop Area Rotary Club is NOT charging anyone for these windows, but instead is requesting donations as the recipient is comfortably able. Inserts are found to improve the warmth and comfort of homes, lower fuel bills, and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. As a reminder, all window inserts must be ordered prior to October 10th and are made specifically for each window. Volunteers are typically motivated by environmental concerns, economic justice, a love of making things with their hands, and/or a desire to participate in a community effort producing concrete, meaningful results.




Oak Hill Forestry Field Day Saturday, October 22, 10:00 AM Oak Hill Conservation Area, Fayette
