How do I

Register your vehicle(s): If you are a new Maine resident Maine law requires you to transfer your out-of-state license and vehicle registration (if applicable) to Maine within 30 days of establishing residency. You will need to bring your title or lien holder information, insurance card and previous registration.

To obtain a Maine Drivers License you will have to go to DMV in Augusta.



Recreational vehicles registrations & sporting licenses can be purchased at the Town Office. First time registrations require a complete bill of sale or a previous registration from another state.

Dog Licenses: Each owner or keeper of a dog 6 months or more shall obtain a license from the municipality where the dog is kept. Dogs not able to produce young cost \$6 and all other \$11. A current Rabies Certificate is required at the time of licensing.

Annual Town Meeting: The Annual Town Meeting is held the 2nd Tuesday of June every year and voting is held 8am to 8pm on the 2nd floor of the Town Office building (Gile Hall).

Register to Vote: You may register to vote at the Town Office or at the voting polls by presenting an ID and proof of residency.

Transfer Station: The Town's Transfer Station is located at 14 Recycle Road which is off the North Road. Window decals are required to use the facility and can be obtain at the Town Office at the Transfer Station with proof of property ownership. Recycling is mandatory, but there are some items that cannot be included with your regular single-sort recycling. Be sure to get a Recycling Guide from the Town Office or Transfer Station.

Did you apply for.....

Homestead Exemption: If you are a homeowner in Readfield you may apply for a Homestead Exemption which will save you property tax dollars if you qualify.

Veteran Property Tax Exemption: If you are a Maine resident and a veteran who served in the U.S. Armed Forces, you may be eligible for a limited exemption from property tax if you meet the qualifications.

Please see the front desk clerk at the Town Office for your exemption forms. All exemption forms are due by April 1st in order to receive the exemptions for the upcoming tax year.



Age Friendly Community: Readfield is an Age Friendly Community and has many programs to help seniors and persons with disabilities. One such program is the Handy Helpers program.

The Handy Helpers provide home repair and maintenance services without charge to older adults who live in their own homes. The only cost is for the parts needed. Work is done by volunteers who make it their mission to help people in our community.

Recreational Trails: Readfield has a Trails Committee who has planned and coordinated

the development of environmentally acceptable trails within the town of Readfield. The committee promotes safe, functional connections between the various activity centers of the town and provides linkage, where possible, between recreational trails within the town and with adjacent towns.
